The economic system of any country is largely dependent upon the efficiency of its transport system. Without the help of a good transport system, the expansion in national and international trade would never take place. Broadly, the means of transport both for purposes of trade and social activity can be classified into three main divisions: land, water and air. We are, here, concerned with transport for trade. Of all the forms of transport, road transport has shown the greatest growth in recent years. Road transport is also used as a complementary means of transport. Road are indispensable links for carrying goods and people to and from railway stations, ports and airports.

Transport by road may be both vehicular and non vehicular. Non vehicular transportation includes both animal and man. Animals such as horse, mules and yaks are frequently used for carrying goods and passengers in hilly areas. Camel is the only means of transport in desert areas. Man is also sometimes used to carry goods. In hilly areas, porters and coolies carry goods on their backs and heads. This type of transport is generally used when animals, carts or vehicles cannot be used. Vehicular transport in developing countries includes the ancient bullock carts, as well as the modern automobiles. The invention of the automobiles has been of great significance to modern industry and commerce because of their high speed and low cost per kilometre. The introduction of the railways have been vital in the growth of industrialization. Railways are useful in carrying heavy and bulky goods over long distances. They are especially favoured because, unlike other modes of transport, they are unaffected by weather conditions.

Water transport is one of the oldest forms of cargo transport. Though it is slow, it is the cheapest form of transport. Water transport includes inland transport and ocean transport. Inland waterways are rivers and canals. While rivers are "naturally" created, canals are artificial waterways. Inland waterways are not always reliable. Sometimes rivers change their course abruptly, which may cause dislocation of traffic. In times of drought they may run dry. Ocean or sea transport is very important for the growth of foreign trade of any country, especially as it is cheaper than air transport. It is particularly useful for carrying bulky goods over long distances, especially when time is not the essential factor.

The greatest advantage of air transport is that it has reduced the time and distance barrier to greater extent. However, air transport is the costliest means of transport because of the high cost of planes, their operation and maintenance. It is generally used rather sparingly for carrying light freight.

A: PROCESS OF MAKING RED BRICKS

Process of making red bricks involves preparation of clay, moulding, drying and burrying in boxes. You need clay for the preparation of bricks. First of all we need pure clay and better to take from 200mm depth. Clean the clay of stones. Then convert the clay into lumps with earth crushing rollers by your feet. If your manufacturing of bricks is on a small scale and manpower is also cheap then you can go for hand moulding. The moulds are in rectangular shape made of wood or steel which are opened at the top and bottom. Now turn the lumps into bricks and let them get dried up. In this stage, the bricks will gain hardness and strength. The last stage is burning of the bricks at 1100 degree centigrade. If the heat is low, bricks Can't be strong. When they get cooled, you have red bricks ready .

PROCESS OF CASTING YOUR VOTE IN ELECTIONS

First, we have to ensure that our name is in the voters list. Then we have to get a voter slip from the ward member. Also we should have some other identity documents like Aadhar card, Voter card, Driving license, Bank passbook, Passport or any government authorized one. After having the slip and identity card, we have to go to the polling booth allotted to us. We have to stand in a queue. At the first bench, our name will be checked by the polling officials. At the second bench someone will make a mark on the left hand pointed finger nail with indelible ink. At the third bench, they will take our signature or thumb impression and give us a slip. If we give the slip to the person at the EVM, he/she will allow us to the ballet box. There, on the ballet box we have to press the button near to the symbol we like. Finally, we can see our vote in the WPAT.

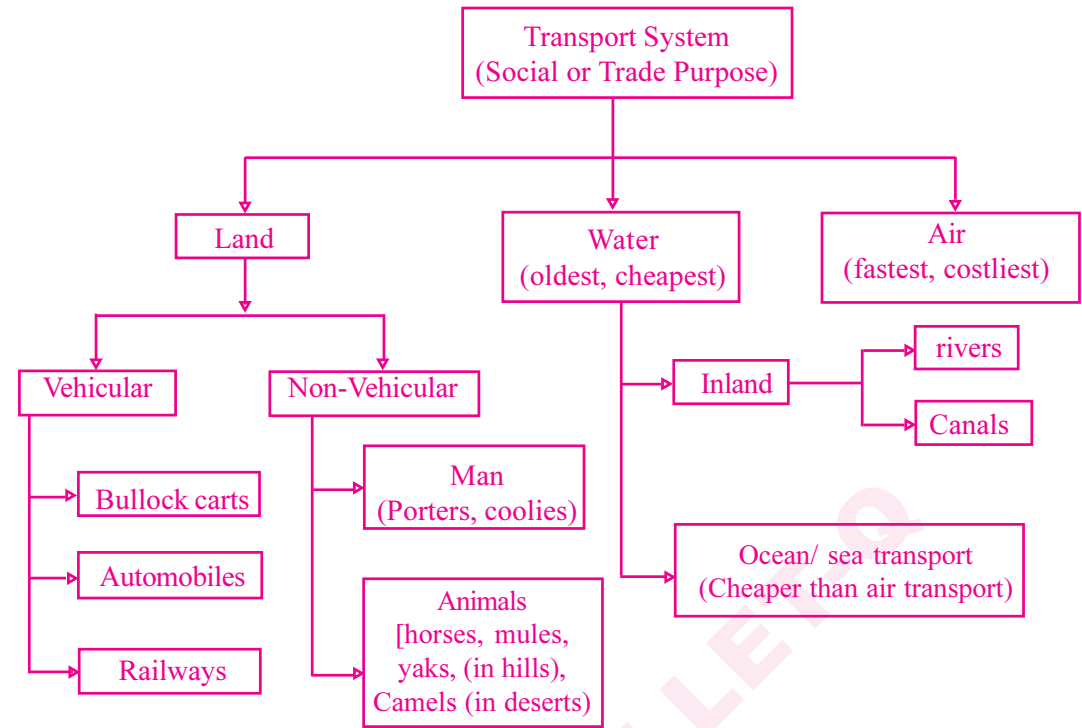
The economic system of any country is largely dependent upon the efficiency of its transport system. Without the help of a good transport system, the expansion in national and international trade would never take place. Broadly, the means of transport both for purposes of trade and social activity can be classified into three main divisions: land, water and air. We are, here, concerned with transport for trade. Of all the forms of transport, road transport has shown the greatest growth in recent years. Road transport is also used as a complementary means of transport. Road are indispensable links for carrying goods and people to and from railway stations, ports and airports.

Transport by road may be both vehicular and non vehicular. Non vehicular transportation includes both animal and man. Animals such as horse, mules and yaks are frequently used for carrying goods and passengers in hilly areas. Camel is the only means of transport in desert areas. Man is also sometimes used to carry goods. In hilly areas, porters and coolies carry goods on their backs and heads. This type of transport is generally used when animals, carts or vehicles cannot be used. Vehicular transport in developing countries includes the ancient bullock carts, as well as the modern automobiles. The invention of the automobiles has been of great significance to modern industry and commerce because of their high speed and low cost per kilometre. The introduction of the railways have been vital in the growth of industrialization. Railways are useful in carrying heavy and bulky goods over long distances. They are especially favoured because, unlike other modes of transport, they are unaffected by weather conditions.

Water transport is one of the oldest forms of cargo transport. Though it is slow, it is the cheapest form of transport. Water transport includes inland transport and ocean transport. Inland waterways are rivers and canals. While rivers are "naturally" created, canals are artificial waterways. Inland waterways are not always reliable. Sometimes rivers change their course abruptly, which may cause dislocation of traffic. In times of drought they may run dry. Ocean or sea transport is very important for the growth of foreign trade of any country, especially as it is cheaper than air transport. It is particularly useful for carrying bulky goods over long distances, especially when time is not the essential factor.

The greatest advantage of air transport is that it has reduced the time and distance barrier to greater extent. However, air transport is the costliest means of transport because of the high cost of planes, their operation and maintenance. It is generally used rather sparingly for carrying light freight.
