





The 'Swachh Bharat Abhiyan' is a massive mass movement that seeks to create a Clean India. To accelerate the efforts to achieve universal sanitation coverage and to put focus on sanitation, the Prime Minister of India, launched the Swachh Bharat Mission on 2 October 2014. The Mission Coordinator shall be Secretary, Ministry of Drinking Water and Sanitation (MDWS) with two Sub-Missions-the Swachh Bharat Mission (Gramin) and the Swachh Bharat Mission (urban). Swachha Andhra Corporation is taking up the activities of construction of Individual Household Toilets, Community Toilets and Public Toilets.


